90 Days Prior to Departure

- Obtain a visa for your destination to Ghana.
- Make sure you have all the necessary vaccinations.

60 Days Prior to Departure

Review the packing list to make sure you have all the clothing, personal supplies, and clinical items needed.

30 Days Prior to Departure

- Leave the MedSchoolCoach phone number of (888) 381-9509 with a parent, in case you need to be reached in emergency.
- Leave copies of your passport, visa, and airline tickets with a parent.



Clinical Experience

There are three primary hospital settings where we have been granted full access approval by the area Governor and the Hospitals Executive Administration. During rotations, students will experience equally Cape Coast Teaching Hospital, Saltpond Hospital, and Abeadze Dominase Clinic.



The Cape Coast Teaching Hospital will serve as our main base of operations and be open for visits for all the surgery observations and physician shadowing, as well as other related departments.

The Central Regional Hospital now Cape Coast Teaching Hospital is currently a 400 bed capacity referral Hospital situated at the Northern part of Cape Coast. It is bounded on the north by Abura Township, on the south by Pedu Estate / 4th Ridge, Nkanfua on the East and Abura / Pedu Estate on the West.

The Hospital, which was the first of a series of ultra-modern Regional Hospitals established by the Ministry of Health, started full operations on 12th August, 1998 and was adjudged the best Regional Hospital in the year 2003.

The Hospital has been transformed into Cape Coast Teaching Hospital with the inception of School of Medical Sciences in the University of Cape Coast. The first batch of the Medical Students graduated from the Teaching Hospital in June, 2013.





Saltpond is a town and capital of the Mfantsiman Municipal District in the Central region of south Ghana. In 1889 the Saltpond Municipal Hospital was opened by the government.

Today, Saltpond provides continued observations of patient care, surgeries, and primary care (especially prenatal) for our students to observe and participate in. There is not an active website for it. It is more of a community hospital serving folks from surrounding villages and communities.



Dominase is a village in the Mfantisman district in the Central Region of Ghana.

In Dominase, students will have access to village care ranging from diabetes, hypertension, prenatal, deliveries, and patients coming to the clinic with general illnesses, such as malaria and cholera. Students will also conduct health screenings for members of the community ranging from taking blood pressures, taking blood sugars, changing and replacing bandages, assist clinicians in basic wound care and assessments. The clinic at Abeadze Dominase will be a very active place for students to perform skills on patients they will be trained on during the trip.

Dr. Sahil Mehta

Dr. Mehta is a practicing Vascular and Interventional Radiologist in Boston, faculty at Harvard Medical School and has extensive global health experience in Botswana, India and the Dominican Republic.



Dr. Renee Marinelli

Dr. Marinelli has practiced family medicine, served on the University of California Admissions Committee, and has helped hundreds of students get into medical school. She spearheads a team of physician advisors who guide MedSchoolCoach students.



Travel Details

Students are responsible for booking roundtrip domestic airfare from their home city to JFK International Airport in New York, NY. Plan to arrive at JFK at least 4 hours prior to departure to Ghana to prepare for international travel and to meet with the group.

Students must then use our program travel agency to book their flight to Kotoka International Airport in Accra, Ghana. This international flight must be purchased through McNair/Direct Travel at dt.com or by calling (703) 836-1100.

As of September 28, 2022, round trip direct flights from New York to Accra on Delta during our travel dates started at \$1,375. Rates can fluctuate dramatically, so we recommend booking early.

Answers to Common Questions

COVID Questions

What happens if the trip is cancelled due to COVID?

The COVID-19 pandemic has affected every aspect of our lives. We anticipate that by January 2022, it will be safe to travel – plenty of time for Summer 2022 trips. In the event we cancel the trip due to COVID-related travel advisories, participants will be eligible for a full refund. Please review the terms and conditions you signed in our Disclosure Form for further details.

What COVID-19 safety precautions will be taken?

Ghana has been a leader in COVID-19 prevention and care. Currently, masks are mandated in all facilities and public spaces and certainly in and around any health care facilities. Standard COVID-19 sanitary procedures are practiced in all dining areas, hotels, etc. As the trip dates near, we will provide real-time updates based on the pandemic situation at the time.

Registration Questions

Is there an application process? Am I eligible to apply?

We require that high school students be at least 16 years of age at the time of their travel. There is no minimum age requirement for college students. All Ultimate Med Immersion students must maintain a minimum 3.0 grade point average. Your GPA will be verified with your undergraduate institution as part of the enrollment process. If you are an international student, you are welcome to participate, but you are responsible for researching and acquiring any incremental travel documents you may need to travel to your program destination.

When must I pay in full by?

An initial non-refundable deposit of \$500 is required to hold your spot. Full payment for the remainder of the tuition balance will be charged to your credit card on file 120 days prior to departure. If you are departing with Group 1 on June 25, 2022, your balance is due by February 25, 2022. If you are departing with Group 2 on July 16, 2022, your balance is due by March 18, 2022.



Clinical Experience Questions

How many observation/shadowing hours will I get?

There will be an average of 5 hours per day of observations on the 9 curriculum days for a total estimation of 45 shadowing hours.

What areas of health care will I visit?

Areas of observation will vary and include cardiovascular, pediatrics, radiology, OB/GYN, family medicine, various surgical procedures, pulmonology, and infectious disease. As the trip dates near, we will provide a more detailed itinerary with specialties and departments to be viewed.

Will I get a letter of recommendation?

Letters of recommendation may be written by any of our U.S. based physician staff members or by the Ghana based physicians, but are not guaranteed. Their solicitation will be at the student's discretion, and be provided by physicians only upon their willingness to provide one.

What are students permitted to do during observation?

This will depend on the area of observation and the attending physician's and/or health care professional's decision. As participants are not trained or certified health care professionals, any actions that are allowed may range from taking vitals to assessment skills, or basic assists with bandaging, etc. Actual hands-on skill techniques are dependent upon the approval of the host institution and the professionals in charge.

Accommodation Questions

What if I want a single room?

All rooms are rated for double occupancy. If you prefer a single room accommodation, an additional charge of \$100 per night will apply. Single occupancy rooms have limited availability and can be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. Contact us at info@medschoolcoach.com or call us at (888) 381-9509 if you are interested in a single room.

How will roommates be assigned for double occupancy room?

All double occupancy pairings will be introduced to their roommates about a month prior to departure so that they may get to know each other.

Do I need special plugs for my electronics to work in Ghana?

In Ghana, the power plugs and sockets are of type D and G. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. While it is possible your hotel could be equipped with standard American outlets, it is highly suggested you bring an adapter kit.



Travel Requirement Questions

Do I need a passport?

You need a valid passport to travel to Ghana. For a new adult passport book, there is a \$110 application fee and a \$35 execution fee.

If you already have a passport, it needs to be valid for at least another 6 months from the date of arrival in Ghana. If it is not, renew it ASAP so that it returns to you prior to the trip. While there is typically an 8-week turnaround, due to COVID-19, passport processing is taking longer than normal. You could expect delays from anywhere between 4 and 6 months.

Do I need a visa?

Yes. Your program director will direct you through the steps of the visa process upon enrollment. A standard visa to Ghana will take about 15 business days to process and will cost about \$129. Timing and pricing may vary, so give yourself extra time.

Do I need travel or tuition insurance?

Yes, all trip participants are required to purchase travel insurance. Travel insurance can be obtained at a cost of about \$200-250, though prices vary. Consider Allianz Travel Insurance at allianztravelinsurance.com.

Additionally, it is recommended you purchase tuition insurance for this portion of your education experience. Consider GradGuard at <u>gradguard.com/tuition</u>.

Once you have paid in-full, any refunds will need to be processed through your travel and/or tuition insurance provider, and not through MedSchoolCoach.

What Shots Are Required and Recommended?

Make sure you are up-to-date on all routine vaccines, including:

- COVID-19
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTP)
- Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR)
- Polio
- Yellow Fever

The CDC recommends that you also receive the following vaccines:

- Typhoid
- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B



How should I book my airfare to and from JFK in New York and Ghana?

Airfare is not included in the tuition. Your roundtrip domestic airfare from your home city to JFK in New York, NY should be purchased by you. Your international roundtrip flight to Accra, Ghana must be purchased through our partners at McNair/Direct Travel. You can contact them at dt.com or by calling them at (703) 836-1100. As of September 28, 2022, round trip direct flights from New York to Accra on Delta during our travel dates started at \$1,375. Rates can fluctuate dramatically, so we recommend booking early.

Student Time & Care Questions

What will I be able to do during my free time?

While in Ghana you will have the opportunity to see and experience many sites and areas of leisure and historical interest. We also realize the desire to explore on your own, and as you are undergrads, we understand that you are not minors needing escorting. You will have time each day or evening that you can explore Accra, the Aburi Botanical Gardens, Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park, Makola Market, or just relax by the pool at the hotel. We encourage you to take the time to explore, yet not miss out on any scheduled program or curriculum activities.

What happens if I get sick while abroad?

Throughout your time in the program you will be with our hosts, as well as MedSchoolCoach staff. They will provide any sick participants with access to the health care needed through existing partnerships. A benefit of attending the UMI is that you will be around all levels of health care in Ghana at all times. Your program managers will ensure that you always have access to staff during your times of feeling ill.

How do I access cash in Ghana? Will my credit or ATM cards work?

U.S. credit/debit cards are widely accepted in Ghana, but U.S. Dollars are not. Upon arrival in Ghana, there will be opportunity to exchange U.S. Dollars for Ghanaian Cedi for daily tips and purchases.

Will there be chaperones on the trip?

Although there will not be chaperones, per se, students will be led by program managers and directors through the entire experience. There will be one program manager for every ~15 students to make sure that everyone on the trip gets specialized attention.
